

May will be filled with opportunities to Go Deeper ...deeper into the soil of our soul and to Bloom!!


May 2nd we will Dig Deep into how to get right with God and with one another as we celebrate Communion Sunday.




Go Deeper into 'The Shack' with us!

WORKSHOP #1 - "Blest Be the Zoom that Binds"

they are not serving technologically advanced churches. Also, this will be a space for open dialog and exchange of ideas
